

Bicentennial: Only Tories Need Apply

A mere five months after its establishment, the Committee for Reunion With England, based in Richmond, Va., has collected \$83 and the support of 150 U. S. citizens who envision a happier life in an America restored to the forgiving arms of Mother England.

And if only another 200 million or so Americans sign up before Queen Elizabeth II arrives in this country for a Bicentennial visit next July, the prodigal colonies will have taken a giant stride toward being restored to grace, John T. Ambrose, cofounder of the committee, said yesterday.

"Otherwise," Ambrose asserted, "the Bicentennial will be nothing but a big fake, a piece of propaganda trying to cover up the mistakes we've made. It's time we realized that the Revolution was nothing more than the self-serving acts of a bunch of hotheads and caused a lot of problems for this country that now can be corrected only by reunion."
